Similarly, the fabulous Friel Sisters return after seven years since their memorable performance at The Green Note during our 20th Festival – we can't wait to welcome them for our Saturday night concert as they celebrate the release of their new album, *Northern Sky*.

This year's festival truly embodies the spirit of 'Returning to London Town'. We're thrilled to welcome back musicians who once called this city home, including Brian Kelly, Charlie Harris, Colm McGonigle, Mick Mulvey, Chan Reid, Josephine Marsh, and Tom Cussen. IMDL's youth performance group, The Trad Gathering, will also perform music from the repertoire of another renowned musical figure who was previously part of the London Irish music scene, the outstanding flute player (and maker), Marcus Hernon.

We dedicate special moments this year to remember two giants who shaped the traditional Irish music and dance community. In 2021, the legendary Seán Keane, Dublin fiddler and longtime Chieftains member, graced our festival alongside Matt Molloy in what became an unforgettable highlight.

We were very sorry to hear the news of Seán's passing in 2023. This year, we honour his memory with a Monday film screening of Seán Keane: A Portrait of an Artist at The Kiln, Kilburn, introduced by two fellow Dublin musicians and important figures in Irish music, Mick (flute) and Liam (fiddle) O'Connor.

In January of this year, we were very sad to lose a huge figure in the London Irish Set Dancing scene, a friend to all and my co-founder of Return to Camden Town Festival, Geoff Holland. We pay tribute to Geoff in the forthcoming pages and through his set dancing and Festival legacy in London.

Our festival offers something for everyone across four incredible days – free, accessible music, song and dance events for those who would like to dip their toes in for the first time; a jampacked triple bill concert programme to really enjoy the music and song up close and personal; workshops for learners of the tradition; the relaxed flow and shared camaraderie of a session; a traditional Irish music quiz for the real aficionados; and ceilis for our enthusiastic set dancing community.

This is more than a festival – it's a homecoming for London's Irish music, song and dance community, a showcase of our vibrant traditions for our friends and neighbours in multicultural London Town, and a chance to make new friends and inspire young and old to get involved!

Our heartfelt thanks go to The Crown and their wonderful team including Craig, Nishkarsh, and Rashmi, along with Renee and Danny at Ashford Place and all our participating venues. 



# **GEOFF HOLLAND**

# Co Founder of Return to Camden Town Festival

We were so very sorry to hear about the recent passing (January 2025) of my friend and partner in all things Festival from way back, the mighty Geoff Holland. Truly a leading light for decades in London - promoting and teaching set dancing, community and Irish music.

Geoff had a fantastic passion for set dancing and Irish music, and a wonderful way of teaching in such a calm manner. He ran his first Sunday of the month céilís at the London Irish Centre (as well as set dancing classes at the venue and Cecil Sharp House) for about 30 years, attracting people from across the country. He was everyone's friend.

I first met Geoff in the very early 1990s. During my first year at university, living in halls of residence on Camden Road, I used to pop along on the odd Tuesday evening at the London Irish Centre. I would sit in and play with my friends, John Coakley and Johnny O'Leary

who were playing for Geoff's regular set dancing class there. Not long after I began teaching music at the Centre myself. In those days we'd often meet Geoff and a host of London's set dancers on the thriving session scene. I have particularly fond memories of regular bursts of set dancing at our Sunday afternoon sessions at the Powerhaus in Islington.

I really came to know Geoff when we were simultaneously considering the idea that London's Irish music and dance community needed a Festival. The London Irish Centre's Director at the time, Jerry Kivlehan was of a similar mindset, and brought us all together to make it happen. In 1999 'Return to Camden Town' Festival was born - It was an exciting time!

We worked closely together as codirectors for the first six years of the Festival (in those days – a 10 day event), both revelling in this wonderful opportunity to bring so many people together in shared love of traditional Irish music, song and dance. Even after Geoff stepped back from his organising role, he remained dedicated to promoting and supporting the Festival.

We were very fortunate that he chose to focus his energies for a large number of years on being the Festival's main photographer – and what a wonderful photographer he was! Geoff had a knack for capturing people in their natural state and always went about his photography in the most wonderfully unobtrusive way.

A man with great ideals - an English man, whose love of our traditions found him firmly at the centre of the London Irish community and whose dedication to set dancing and music helped to spread his knowledge and love to the masses – a great partner to Noreen, dedicated family man and grandfather – Geoff Holland was loved by many and will be sorely missed.

Sending continued love and deepest sympathies to Noreen, Marion and all of Geoff's family and friends.

# DANÍ

For three decades, Danú have been at the heart of Irish traditional music, captivating audiences with their virtuosity, creativity, and deep connection to Ireland's cultural heritage. Formed in 1995 in County Waterford, the band's journey began with an impromptu session after a céilí in Dungarvan. In 1996, the group were invited to represent Ireland at the Inter Celtique Festival in Lorient, Brittany, where they won the prestigious Boules Des Korrigans award for best up-and-coming band.

Over the years, they have toured extensively across Europe, the Middle East, and North America, gracing stages at iconic venues and major festivals across the UK, Denmark, France and beyond. Danú's recordings have earned critical acclaim. Their live performances have been broadcast on NPR, CBC, and the BBC.

Danú's current lineup, features Benny McCarthy (button accordion), Nell Ní Chróinín (vocals, tin whistle), Oisín McAuley (fiddle, backing vocals), Éamon Doorley (bouzouki), Tony Byrne (guitar), Ivan Goff (pipes, flute, whistle), and Billy Sutton (bodhrán, mandolin, backing vocals).

To celebrate their 30th anniversary, Danú is releasing The Pearl Album (Live in Celebration), a stunning collection of 30 tracks recorded live in over 25 iconic venues. The album showcases the band's mastery of traditional Irish music, blending intricate instrumental arrangements with Nell Ní Chróinín's exceptional vocals



# **AOIFE AND DEIRDRE GRANVILLE**

Aoife and Deirdre Granville grew up in a bilingual home in the town of Dingle, Co Kerry, where they learned much of their music. Aoife is a flute player and fiddler as well as singer and currently works at the Folklore Department at University College Cork. She was appointed to the Arts Council in 2022 and is currently recording her third solo album.

Deirdre is a harpist, flute player and singer and released her first solo album Imram a few years ago. She is a board member of Harp Ireland and a secondary school music teacher in Dingle. Deirdre was recently awarded an artistic residency at Centre Culturel Paris, where she completed a compositional project.

Aoife and Deirdre recently recorded duet tracks on Beauty an Oileáin, a collection of music and song from the Blasket Islands recorded by descendants of islanders. They have just completed the recording of a duet album which will soon be released. Aoife and Deirdre's music and interpretation of songs have been shaped considerably by the traditions of West Kerry.



# THE TRAD GATHERING

IMDL's London-wide youth project The Trad Gathering features a large group of young traditional Irish musicians led by Karen Ryan and Pete Quinn. The project was founded in 2008; jointly commissioned by

the BBC Proms and Return to Camden Town Festival.

In recent years, the group have been celebrating music from the repertoires of prominent members of the London Irish music scene, including:

Bryan Rooney, The McCarthy Family, Roger Sherlock, Lucy Farr, Danny Meehan, John Bowe, Julia Clifford, Mick O'Connor and Tommy Maguire. The Trad Gathering have performed at the Royal Albert Hall, Cadogan Hall, Kings Place, Royal Festival Hall, Mayor of London's St Patrick's Day Festival at Trafalgar Square and many more.

This evening, members of the group will play their debut performance of tunes from the repertoire of the legendary Connemara flute player, Marcus Hernon.

# **ALEX KELLY**



County Sligo concertina player, Alex Kelly, comes from a very musical family. He was a member of the national award winning Sligo group: Spraoi. He has been a highly valued member of the traditional Irish session scene here in London ever since he moved over in recent years – first playing sessions in West London with Dublin accordionist, Conal Cuttle and fiddler, Deirdre Glynn and now a regular session

player across London. In 2019 he was involved in performances of Michael Rooney's De Cuéllar Suite which pays tribute to the Spanish Armada. Alex works in London as a secondary school teacher.

Alex is regularly very well received as a tutor at our annual Festival – we are delighted to welcome him back to teach at Return to London Town Festival this year.

# **CATHAL Ó CURRÁIN**



**Cathal Ó Curráin** is a multi-instrumentalist from Gaoth Dobhair,

Donegal, who specialises in Irish Traditional and Folk Music on fiddle, banjo, bouzouki and song. From an early age Cathal was immersed in music from attending regular sessions in Teach Hiúdaí Beag with the likes of Mairéad and Ciarán Ó Maonaigh. Hailing from a family that are best known for their singing Cathal learned his songs from his aunties Caitlín and Bríd Joe Jack.

Performing from a young age Cathal has travelled the world with different bands to America, Australia, New Zealand and all throughout Europe. His most recent work features on albums with The High Seas, The Friel Sisters, Bláth na hÓige, Aoife Scott with Ron Block of Alison Krauss and Union Station and his debut solo album Cosán Ceoil was launched in 2022.

Cathal also presents an Irish Language Music Programme on TG4 called Féile an Earagail showcasing some of the best folk music in Ireland.

He was awarded "Best Emerging Artist" at the 2022 RTÉ Radio 1 Folk Awards.

# TARA BREEN AND MARTY BARRY



Tara Breen is a highly acclaimed Irish musician and a celebrated figure in the world of traditional Irish music. Born and raised in County Clare, Tara developed a deep connection to Irish music from a young age, hugely influenced by her musician father Martin. Tara's musical journey began in her early childhood when she was introduced to the fiddle, she honed her skills under the guidance of local musicians and teachers.

Tara gained numerous All-Ireland titles in both fiddle and flute.

Tara's reputation as a skilled musician quickly spread, leading her to collaborate with some of the most respected names in Irish music. Tara joined the legendary bands, Stockton's Wing and The Chieftains. Her performances with the groups have taken her to prestigious venues worldwide. Tara was also a founding member of Ciorras, a group formed as part of the TG4 series Lorg Lunny, which showcased emerging Irish talent under the mentorship of Dónal Lunny.

Tara is a full time member of both Breen/ Rynne/ Muarry and Notify. Her playing of fiddle, flute and saxophone appears on recordings with these bands and other recordings due to her high demand as a session musician. Tara's debut solo album *Sooner or Later* is officially released this year.



Marty Barry is a traditional musician and sinaer Banbridge County Down, playing guitar and banjo. Marty gained a huge interest in music from a young age, he went on to study at the University of Limerick. Since graduating, Marty has been a full time performer/ tutor and is working on his debut solo album. He has toured extensively throughout Europe, Australia and China. Marty's recording credits on traditional albums include Caitlin Nic Gabhann, Ciarán Ó Maonaigh and Cathal Ó Curráin's album The High Seas, Alan Reid and Rachel Conlon's A Quare Yield. Marty performs regularly with The Friel Sisters recording on their latest release Northern Sky.

# **BRIAN KELLY AND TAD SARGENT**



Brian Kelly learnt banjo and mandolin in London under the tutelage of Clare man Brendan Mulkere. He has gained 8 All Ireland titles in various age groups. Brian has been a key member of the London Irish music scene, holding residencies at The Swan Stockwell with Gino Lupari and The Stags Head, Camden Town with Paddy Gallagher. He now lives, teaches and performs music in Cavan.

Brian launched his eponymous debut album at Return to Camden Town Festival in 2001, he followed it up with Plain of Jars in 2006 and is currently working on his 3rd album. Brian released two albums with his band The Long Notes, has had two Top 10 hits with dance-trad fusion band Dance to Tipperary and released Gods and Fighting Men in 2015 with Creeds Cross. Brian has toured Ireland, Britain, Europe and the USA with Shane MacGowan and The Popes. Other international performance and recording credits include: Mark Nevin (Fairground Attraction), Steve Wickham (Waterboys), Festival Interceltique L'Orient, Gaelforce Dance, Dance Masters and Celtic Nights Irish Dance Shows.



Tad Sargent, London-born with roots in Castlebar, Co. Mayo, brings a rich rhythmic energy to the stage through his bodhrán bouzouki playing. has performed and recorded with a diverse range of top artists, including Tony Christie, CrossHarbour. Cara Dillon Ranagri and toured extensively across Europe and the US. He has graced many prestious stages including The Royal Albert Hall, Shakespeare's Globe, Hop Farm, Cambridge Folk and Glastonbury Festivals - as well as making numerous appearances on BBC and other major broadcasters.

London audiences will know Mick Mulvey as an erstwhile of the London-Irish traditional music scene through the 70s, 80s and 90s, but he always maintained strong links with his Leitrim roots. His two acclaimed solo recordings; Within a Mile o 'Jamestown (2003) and Bridging the Gap (2009) – were both launched in Leitrim and at the Return to Camden Town Festival in London.

Shane Meehan grew up in Carrickon-Shannon, starting off his musical journey with his grandfather, John, in Cootehall, Co. Roscommon. John's passion for researching rare tunes was passed down to his grandson.

Shane listened avidly composers such as Charlie Lennon, Josephine Keegan, Ed Reavy, Joe Liddy, and Paddy Fahy. Major playing influences include the legendary Sligo fiddle players and the Leitrim musicians he grew up playing with, mainly in Cryan's Teach Cheoil. Shane and Mick were both foundermembers of The Moylurg Ceili Band, winners of the Senior Céilí Band in Derry in 2013. In 2019 Shane's debut solo album Twill Do - featuring 19 of his own compositions.

The new album from this duet, The Missing Guest, is a celebration of Leitrim's musical heritage - a treasure trove of old and new tunes brought to life by these two outstanding musicians. Their deep understanding, respect and passion for the music of Leitrim and north Connacht shines through every track.

Liverpool-born pianist **Pete Quinn** has performed with some of the greats of traditional Irish music including Brendan McGlinchey, Bryan Rooney, Mary MacNamara, John Bowe and Mick O'Connor. He has featured as accompanist on a number of recordings including five albums with The London Lasses, plus solo albums from whistle player Peter McAlinden, fiddlers Karen Ryan and Seán Casey, and flute player Mick Mulvey.

Nell was exposed to these local traditions of the area from a very young age. She began singing at the age of 11 under a local singing scheme Aisling Gheal, whose aim is to preserve local songs by teaching them to the younger generation, thus ensuring their preservation. She has enjoyed success in her singing career to date. Her achievements include several underage singing medals and titles from various Irish festival competitions as prestigious as the Oireachas na Gaeilge and The Fleadh Ceoil.

Nell is also the youngest ever recipient to receive both 'TG4's Gradam Ceoil Traditional Singer of the Year' award in 2012 and the prestigious Corn Uí Riada award which she was awarded in 2014. . Nell remains true to her local Múscraí Gaeltacht singing heritage, citing the local influences of her parents, Máire Ní Cheilleachair Foiní Maidhicí Ó Suilleabháin and Eilís Ní Shuilleabháin. She is currently the lead singer in the well-renowned traditional band, Danú, with whom she tours with on a regular basis.

# THE FRIEL SISTERS



Anna Sheila and Clare Friel are traditional musicians from Doire na Mainséar, Donegal, Born in Glasgow. the sisters credit their main musical development to frequent trips to Ireland, partaking in workshops across the country, many of which they now teach themselves.

Since the launch of their debut album, The Friel Sisters have performed at venues and festivals across Europe, America and Asia. They have shared the stage with acts including Altan, The Chieftains, Lúnasa Sharon Shannon and Cherish the Ladies.

In 2016, the sisters performed at Festival Interceltique de Lorient, and won the prestigious Trophée Loïc Raison. In 2018, the girls released their second album Before the Sun featuring Hajime Takahashi on guitar and Cathal Ó Curráin on houzouki

In 2018. Clare was awarded TG4's Gradam Ceoil Ceoltóir Óg na Bliana /Young Musician of the Year, performing solo and also with Anna, Sheila and Cathal on TG4 as part of the live awards show. The audience included Irish President Michael D. Higgins. On the night, she was given the award by the great Mairéad Ní Mhaoniagh.

The Friel Sisters are excited to launch their long-awaited third album, Northern Sky.

This evening, Anna, Sheila and Clare will be joined by their regular accompanists in the band - Co Donegal's Cathal Ó Curráin (bouzouki, vocal) and Co. Down's Marty Barry (guitar, vocals).

# MAEVE DONNELLY, CHARLIE HARRIS, ÉAMONN AND GERALDINE COTTER



Maeve Donnelly, now living in Co Clare, grew up in East Galway, an area steeped in traditional music. Maeve is highly respected and much sought after as a fiddle teacher at Festivals across Ireland and further afield. She started playing fiddle at the age of six and won her first All-Ireland Fiddle Competition at the age of nine. She has toured extensively and was a member of Moving Cloud. In 2004, Maeve recorded a duet album with Peadar O'Loughlin entitled The Thing Itself. In more recent years, she has released two solo albums. Her latest album. Flame on the Banks was recorded with quitarist Tony McManus.

Charlie Harris, is an accordion player, originally from Kilmallock area of Co. Limerick. In 1974 he moved to London where he met and was influenced by brothers Oliver and Raymond Roland, both had been heavily influenced by the expressively charismatic Joe Cooley. Charlie returned to his 'musical home' of Co. Galway in 1981, here he earned a nationwide reputation for his tuning and repairs of accordions. He toured and recorded several albums with the band Shaskeen. Charlie was awarded the prestigious TG4 Gradam Ceoil Traditional Musician of the Year Award in 2009. Charlie is a long time member of the Tulla Céilí Band and a regular visitor to London with Sliabh Aughty.

Éamonn Cotter, originally from Ennis but living in Kilmaley in Co. Clare for over 25 years, is a well-known and respected flute player, teacher and flute maker. Éamonn is a member of Shaskeen. He has recorded on many albums including his most recent solo CD, The Knotted Chord. As well as traditional music, he also has a keen interest in Western Art music and jazz. He is a member of the Limerick Jazz Workshop.

Geraldine Cotter. Ėamonn's sister, is a well-known teacher. researcher and performer iron both the tin whistle and piano. She has published three bestselling tutors for tin whistle and piano, the most recent one Rogha, is a tune book with accompanying play-a-long CD. She has recorded on over 20 CDs including her second solo album, Ré Órga which was released in 2024. In 2017 she was honoured with a MÓRglór award for her contribution to traditional music in County Clare.

All four musicians have been featured on many radio and television programmes, including TG4 Gradam Cheoil 2009, on the occasion of the presentation of Charlie's Gradam award.

# LIAM O'CONNOR



**Liam O'Connor**, award-winning fiddle player and Chief Executive of the Irish Traditional Music Archive since 2019, is recognised as one of Ireland's outstanding traditional musicians

Born into a musical family in Dublin, he was immersed in the tradition from an early age through his father Mick O'Connor, the renowned flute player, researcher, and author. His music was further shaped by legendary visitors to the family home, including Seán Keane, Joe Ryan, Séamus Glackin and Vincent Harrison. A five-time All-Ireland champion and TG4 Ceoltóir Óg na Bliana (Young Music of the Year) 2002, Liam's playing is noted for its technical mastery and deep respect for the tradition. His solo album The Loom (2017) was named Traditional Album of the Year by The Irish Times, and in June 2025 he released Into the Loam. a duet with Cormac Begley, at a sold-out Vicar Street concert. He has recorded and performance with Liam O'Flynn, Noel Hill, Tony MacMahon, Seán McKeon, and many others. Notably, the last time Liam performed in London was with the late Liam O'Flynn, over twenty years ago.

Now based in Dublin, Colm continues to be an active presence at traditional music festivals throughout Ireland and beyond, frequently appearing on national television and radio. In summer 2025, he featured as a soloist with the Ceol Mharlaí Chamber Orchestra at Féile Nasc, at an Chruit Bheo and at Electric Picnic. He also taught workshops at Rencontres Irlandaises de Tocane. We are delighted to welcome Colm once again back to London.

# **BRENDAN DEMPSEY**

Manchester born Irish tenor banjo player, Brendan Dempsey started playing at the age of 12 at St Wilfred's Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Eireann, taught by Bob Tracey. Brendan won the Senior All Ireland Banjo title in Sligo in 1989. Over the years Brendan has had the pleasure of playing internationally, most notably: Hong Kong and various parts of the United States of America including Boston, New York and St Louis. It is many years since Brendan played at Return to Camden Town Festival, we look forward to welcoming him back.



# **CHAN REID**



Chan was born into a musical family in Dublin, she was taught classical piano and singing from a young age by her grandmother Joan Kelly, Chan started immerse herself in sean nós singing and Irish fiddle when she was at university in Dublin. She attended the Royal Academy of Irish Music and Royal College of Music. She has sung in choirs all her life, she has been leading singing for choirs, unaccompanied and harmony workshops for almost 20 years. Chan is an active folk and traditional singer, song collector and musician as part of the Irish diaspora in England, where she chairs a Comhaltas branch in the South East and teaches Irish fiddle and singing to adults and children. She has toured extensively as a solo artist and quest performer (includina with The London Lasses) and has participated in a number of TG4 Irish language series and music documentaries as a sean nós singer.

Chan is a member of Celtic folk duo Bold Reilly and enjoys a full and varied folk festival tour schedule each year playing songs she has written, as well as songs from her ever expanding Irish repertoire. Chan has recently formed a new close harmony folk duo The Fox In The Reeds with her partner.

Chan was ITMA's Saothar Composer in December 2024.

Tom Cussen, plays tenor banjo and mandolin, originally from County Limerick, now a long time resident of Galway. Tom spent many years in London and founded the band Shaskeen there in 1970, who have recorded 10 albums to date.

As well as being Shaskeen's band leader, Tom is the maker of the renowned Clareen banjos (www. banjo.ie). Since his semi-retirement, Tom's son, Fintan is now in charge of the business. Tom and Tony Howley (RIP) recorded an album together called There is Always Room in Our House featuring banjo and saxophone.

Tom has recently released an album of archive recordings of fiddler Maureen Minogue-Brown

from Galway, who spent many years playing music in London and was a huge influence on Tom's playing.

Tom's Banjo Maintenance workshop covers a wide range of topics, including Choosing a banjo, what to look for etc. Banjo set up to include choice of strings, banjo head tension, setting action, setting intonation , bridge position etc, plectrum styles and use, getting the best tone, and many more tips. # Written by Tom Cussen:

The story of this recording started back in 1969 in Maureen Minogue's home in Kentish Town. The Irish traditional music scene in London at this time as I discovered was widespread and in a very healthy state.

I met Maureen at a session and asked her if I could record some of her music so that I could learn tunes.

The CD is the result of those recordings and today with the help of modern technology, 55 years later, I am able to bring this selection of Maureen's fiddle playing style and quality to a new and wider audience.

Many thanks to Maureen's family (they are the children in the background on some of the tracks) who have been very supporting, encouraging and involved in this project. It must also be acknowledged that Maureen was a founding member of Shaskeen and was a resident member of the Céilí Band in the Galtymore in

Cricklewood for many years. She has also played on Reg Hall's *It* Was Great Altogether! The Continuing Tradition of Irish Music in London.

On retiring to Ireland in the early 90s, Maureen continued to play and teach music and was actively involved with her local Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Éireann.

I had encouraged Maureen to do a commercial recording of her fiddle playing but she kind of always put it off till later. I am pleased to posthumously present this recording with the help and blessing of Maureen's family and to offer this extraordinary portrayal of East Galway/ London fiddle playing style from Maureen.

# MICK O'CONNOR

(London Banjo)



London's own Mick O'Connor, who plays Tenor Banjo, Mandolin, inherited a love of Irish music from his parents who came from County Kerry and Roscommon in Ireland. He learned tunes from the great London Irish musicians, including John Bowe, Bobby Casey, Tommy McCarthy, and Roger Sherlock, and is particularly influenced by Clare, Galway and Kerry styles of playing.

All Ireland winner on the tenor banjo in 1971, Mick has been playing since 1967 and is a veteran of the great days of the London Irish music scene of the 1960s, 70s and 80s.

In 2013, he was honoured by Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Éireann, which bestowed its Bardic Award on him for his 'exceptional contribution to the promotion of Ireland's cultural traditions'.

# IN SAFE HANDS:

An Illustrated History of Irish Traditional Music in Dublin, 1893-1970

This powerful account of Dublin's traditional music from 1893 to 1970 is more than history or scholarship. It is a lifetime's harvest of music, images and stories, reflecting Michael O'Connor's deep love for the tradition and its makers. Richly illustrated and carefully researched, it captures all aspects of the revival in Dublin and beyond.

Though not always the first place associated with the Irish music revival, Dublin emerges here as a vital centre, where musicians from across Ireland shared their artistry with families, bands and groups throughout the city. Their talent, coupled with improved teaching, helped secure traditional music's place as one of Ireland's foremost art forms

O'Connor gives a human face to the musicians, tracing their lives, struggles and achievements across seventy-seven years—charting a journey from near extinction to international recognition. He shows how the music has been bound to freedom, cultural expression and national pride.

Special attention is paid to piping, from marching bands to céilí groups, with the author— himself a musician—placing the tradition 'in safe hands' with today's young uilleann pipers.

Many featured musicians, including Séamus Ennis, Willie Clancy and Bobby Casey, spent formative years in Dublin before emigrating to London This is a remarkable, once-in-alifetime story of music, resilience and renewal.

# **LONDON IRISH PENSIONERS CHOIR**



Founded over 10 years ago, The Irish Pensioners Choir Band brings together more than 30 older Irish people, most in their 70s and 80s, coming from all over Ireland and making their homes here in London over many decades. Although an independent group, it has been supported by the Irish Elderly Advice Network throughout this time.

The choir has performed for audiences of tens of thousands, including several years at London's St Patrick's Day celebrations in Trafalgar Square.

Members also performed as part of the Irish community choir in the Royal Albert Hall in honour of President Michael D Higgins' state visit to Britain in 2014. They have sung on national television for Sir Terry Wogan on ITV and on the BBC's The One Show. They have performed on RTÉ Radio and Television, and are regularly played by Donncha Ó Dúlaing on the very popular Fáilte Isteach.

The choir has recorded a beautiful album of old Irish songs, Songs of Love and Emigration,

which has been very popular with the Irish community, both in London and in Ireland.

This afternoon they are supported by a band of fantastic musicians many of whom will be familiar faces to this part of the festival, namely Nora Mulready (fiddle and vocals), Caroline Regan (concertina and vocals), Caroline Hetherton (vocals), Ciara Holland (guitar and vocals), Nathalie McDermott (vocals), Ed Anderton (guitar) and Billy Faughnan (keyboard).

Seán Keane (1946-2023) earned world renown as a pivotal member of The Chieftains, the group he joined in 1968 after coming to prominence with Ceoltóirí Chualann and the

Castle Céilí Band earlier in the decade. His powerful fiddle playing married technical virtuosity with insight and a deep understanding of what made Irish traditional music distinctively beautiful. In this documentary profile, directed by Dermot O'Hanlon and produced by the Irish Traditional Music Archive, Seán recalls a range of musical influences from early days listening to James Morrisson and Frank O'Higgins on a wind-up gramophone and his great admiration for the musical and managerial skills of Paddy Moloney. Seán's talents are extolled by fellow traditional musicians Paddy Glackin, Mick O'Connor, Liam O'Connor, Matt Molloy and Doireann Ní Ghlacáin who speaks of the "overwhelming feeling of joy" which his music creates.



**Liam O'Connor**, award-winning fiddle player and Chief Executive

of the Irish Traditional Music Archive since 2019, is recognised as one of Ireland's outstanding traditional musicians (see page? for more information). Alongside performing, Liam authored a major biography of P. W. Joyce, published by Palgrave Macmillan in 2025, and he is Executive Producer of ITMA's acclaimed film and television projects, including the award-winning Farewell to Hughes's with Brendan Gleeson,


Drawing from the Well/ Taoscadh on Tobar, and a forthcoming documentary on Christy Moore's archive. Through ITMA's Drawing from the Well series, he has worked with leading artists to share the riches of the archive and the tradition with new audiences worldwide. Liam and ITMA are now eager to develop meaningful ways to celebrate and connec with the living tradition in London over the coming months and years.



**Mick O'Connor** is originally from The Liberties area of Dublin where many of the Dublin piping families lived.

He was a member of the Piper's Club in the late 1950s through to the 1970s where he trained the Pipers' Club Céilí Band. Mick is a well-known flute player, archivist, researcher and music historian. As a musician, he has broadcast and recorded with Seán Keane of The Chieftains and Charlie Lennon. In the 1960s, he was leader of the popular Castle Céilí Band and led them to success at Fleadh Cheoil na hÈireann in 1965 and Oireachtas na Gaeilge Céilí Band Championships on four occasions. He is a popular lecturer and teacher at

Scoil Samhraidh Willie Clancy and formerly Scoil Eigse. He was a member of a sub-committee that was instrumental in organising the 1968 uilleann piping Tionól in Bettystown, Co. Meath, which resulted in the formation of Na Píobairí Uilleann, For many vears Mick has been involved in the design and production of LPs. CDs. videos and books relating to Irish music. This year he published his comprehensive 551 page book In Safe Hands - An Illustrated History of Irish Traditional Music in Dublin (1893 -1970).
